Scholarship Program Instructions Rev: 3/17

In 1989 the Barrick Foundation established a scholarship program for graduating seniors. Awards are made to well-rounded students who demonstrate a need and a desire to continue their education. Our emphasis is to recognize students who may not have received significant scholarships from other sources. Applicants are reminded to be forthright and as current as possible for scholarship(s) where notifications have already been received.

It is expected that submissions are responsive to all items from the format set out below. All information requested must be in the applicant's package. Failure to do so may result in disqualification. We attempt to announce awards at the scheduled awards assembly for each school.

General Information:

- Applicants must be a 2017 High School graduate of the Tooele School District to include, Blue Peak, Grantsville, Stansbury, or Tooele.
- Submit completed package to your Scholarship Coordinator in your Counseling Office.
- Payment of scholarship will be made following receipt of a copy of your freshman year (1st term) class schedule, following registration. This would normally be in the summer of 2017 prior to the school's 2017 fall term. Award payments can be expected to begin after mid-July of 2017.
- This scholarship may be deferred for up to a 2 year period upon written request. Failure to coordinate deferral may result in cancellation of the award.
- This scholarship is not renewable.
- Dependent children of Foundation Trustees are ineligible for consideration.
- Do not include photographs or copies of certificates and awards with your submission.
- The following format is provided as a guide. This "form" was not designed for use as adequate room for your replies was intentionally ***not provided***.
- Applications will not be returned once the selection process is completed.
- **Deadline for receipt of applications at your respective counseling office is April 20, 2017.**

* 1. Include one endorsement letter from a community individual (not associated with your school) addressing such items but not limited to, citizenship, character, competency, commitment, or leadership in community activities.

* 2. Include one endorsement from an official or teacher from your school, addressing such items such as your leadership, character, participation in school activities and academic achievements.

3. A certified copy of your academic records is required.

4. Prepare an essay of five hundred words or less describing your education objectives and career goals. You may wish to address challenges that you identify as hurdles to completing your goals and how you plan to address/overcome these issues.
